

# RURAL WOMEN IN PAKISTAN - STATUS REPORT 2018 LABOUR FORCE PARTICIPATION OF RURAL WOMEN

Women's multidimensional work spans productive, reproductive, care, and community and social work. The standardized system of national accounts (SNA) as reflected in Labour Force Survey (LFS) measures work as "work for pay, profit or family gain at least for one hour in the last reference week", considered as employed and "actively searching for job in the last reference week" considered as unemployed.

# LABOUR FORCE PARTICIPATION RATES (LFPR)







# EMPLOYED RURAL WOMEN WITH CHILDREN UNDER 5




## LFPR OF WORKERS (AGES 15-64)

52% are in animal production




## **UNPAID WORK OF RURAL WOMEN**

Refined labour force participation was estimated by using standard economic definition of reference week

- 1. Did work in last week for pay, profit or family gain for at least 1 one hour
- 2. Was actively searching for the job in last week.

The augmented labour includes the additional probing question apart from standard economic approach such as has performed any of the following tasks in last week:

Agricultural operations, Processing food, Livestock operations, Poultry raising, Construction work, Collection of firewood or cotton sticks, and Bringing water from outside to the house, taking food from house to farm.
