





73% of employed rural females are paid below PKR 12,000²


VALUING RURAL WOMEN'S UNPAID WORK (PKR BILLION)

Estimated value of the work of unpaid female family workers is PKR **683.3** billion (rural male PKR 539 billion)


The value of work by young (ages 15-24) unpaid family workers is **30%** (PKR 203 billion) of the above, almost all in the informal sector

SHARE AND VALUE OF UNPAID WORK IN GDP3AND EMPLOYMENT IN 2014/15


% contribution of all employment in GDP

Technical Notes

The economic contribution of unpaid family workers (ages 15-64) is estimated from the Labour Force Survey (LFS 2014/15), using following methodology:

- The median wages of male and female workers in same occupations as the unpaid family workers are used (2-digit occupational classifications)
- All unpaid family workers who work 35 hours and above are assumed to be full-time workers and assigned full wages.
- Unpaid family workers who worked less than 35 hours are assigned a proportion of full-time work based on their hours of work and commensurate median wages.
- Proportion median wages were converted into annual wages to calculate the contribution of unpaid family workers.
